Winter Maintenance Checklist

Preventative maintenance is a great way to protect your generator investment. When storms roll through, your generator may need some additional preventative care.

Here are some steps you can take to ensure the **reliability** of your equipment by being prepared for the sleet, snow, freezing rain, and whatever else may come your way.

Repairs and Maintenance

	Address any outstanding quotes for repairs from your generator service company
	Complete any necessary repairs to the cooling systems including coolant flushing and fresh antifreeze
	Make sure block heaters are plugged in and functional
	Make sure the diesel or propane tank is full
	Replace the battery if it needs replacement
	 Residential - every 3 years// Commercial - every 4 years
	✓ If you have a residential preventative maintenance agreement with us, we'll replace your battery every 4th preventative maintenance visit at no extra charge.
Generator Access	
	Keep your generator clear of weeds, trees, debris, and snow Allow at least 2' of clearance around the unit in every direction
	Lubricate door locks to prevent them from freezing up

For <u>ultimate peace of mind</u>, consider adding a 24/7 remote monitoring system to your residential or commercial generator system.
